

TOWN ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

- Met with our Technical Project Manager and others, on the Alum treatment project. More details included later on the agenda, with a broad overview of the meeting as a handout in your package.
- The Hall was full this Friday and Saturday, with a company wide meeting, silent movie night and a Patrick Ross concert. Requests for Hall use continue to rise, with folks requesting use all the way out until June so far.
- The structure that was torn down and burned without a permit on 244 and Rt 5 was doused on Sunday. The EPA has been notified and they checked in with Wayne to let him know they were handling the situation from here.
- A change in the Grant In Aid Program (Lake Morey Greeter Program) will allow up to 75% of costs to be reimbursed, up from roughly 40% from previous years!
- Working with Laura Tucker to help residents around the lake sign up for the alerts and updates of the Alum Project. An informational postcard was mailed to all affected residents but signing up for the alerts was an unclear process initially.
- The Special Meeting Warning is ready to be signed and posted, I have already been in contact with the JO to get it in this week's issue as well. I will add it to the list serve everyday as well to increase noticeability
- The architectural firm we are working with on the Vault project has had a change of ownership and a name change: Randall T Mudge and Associates has changed its name to Mudge Greely Architects. Jeremy Greely is still our main point of contact.
