

## TOWN ADMINISTRATOR REPORT 03-04-24

- Several updates for the Alum Treatment Permitting Process, Peter and I will update under new business
- Successfully submitted the 2024 Aquatic Nuisance Control Grant in Aid application. The total project cost submitted was based directly on last year's numbers, around \$52k, a large portion of the project is in-kind donation from the Adopt-A-Lake program. Last year we received a little over \$12k in aid from this grant, they have informed applicants that the amounts should be larger this year. I am working on setting up the Greeter Team and we have a few interested folks looking to help out at the beach, including trained lifeguards
- I attended a Q&A concerning the Library Grant that we are applying for. Now that we have an understanding that we would like to pursue a manufactured building rather than bring the current building up to code and expand, we have an increased rubric score on the application itself. I confirmed with the grant team that projects will not be partially funded, which means that if we are denied this grant we can still pursue the next opportunity in the fall. We will hopefully be meeting with a team at Geobarns in White River Junction this week to discuss a high level overview of the new library building. The application deadline is on 3/12
- With the rockslide on I-91 closing down the interstate and funneling traffic through town, I helped Wayne work with AOT to get some additional traffic calming measures in place. This morning, a deputy was sent to help Wayne at the School Street and Bridge Street intersections during the morning rush. The estimated day to re-open the interstate is currently Thursday the 7<sup>th</sup>.
- I've got some follow up questions out to Rita Seto about what does and doesn't qualify for the Complete Streets Reporting form that was recently sent out. There is a lot of emphasis on projects completed with "only Town funds" that I'm looking for clarification on.
- I will be taking this Thursday and Friday, 3/7 and 3/8 off this week to go out of town.
