

TOWN ADMINISTRATOR REPORT 5-28-24

- The sprinkler system repair went well, they showed up around 7 rather than 8am and it took almost 5 hours, but we are fully operational again. They will be back this Thursday to test the fire alarm and emergency lights system
- All additional tax exemption paperwork related to the fire truck purchase has been filled out and submitted today
- Attended a Grant Basics webinar through VLCT, this one focused on the administrative side of Grant tracking but didn't really address our issues of tracking multiple grant projects at one time, though Jess and I are working on that problem ourselves
- There are two final contracts to sign in your packets from SOLitude and Arrowwood, updates coming during old business
- I reached out to Logan Perron at the VTrans about the use of engine breaks through the village, his reply was that the State will never post a sign discouraging the use of vehicle safety features, which engine breaks are considered
- We have energy assessments for the old fire station and the library tomorrow, I will be here to facilitate as I did with the EMS building and Town Hall.
- We had two Greeters have to bow out of the program over the weekend due to personal and family issues, I'll seek out others to fill the slots immediately, as the Greeter Training opportunities are limited
- Andrew Godfrey let me know that he received applications for two new members for the Fire Department
- There is a dangerous overhanging tree limb on Bald Top that I have contacted Longto Tree Service to take care of
- I have contacted Hammond Brush Grinding Services to get rid of the brush pile at the transfer station.
